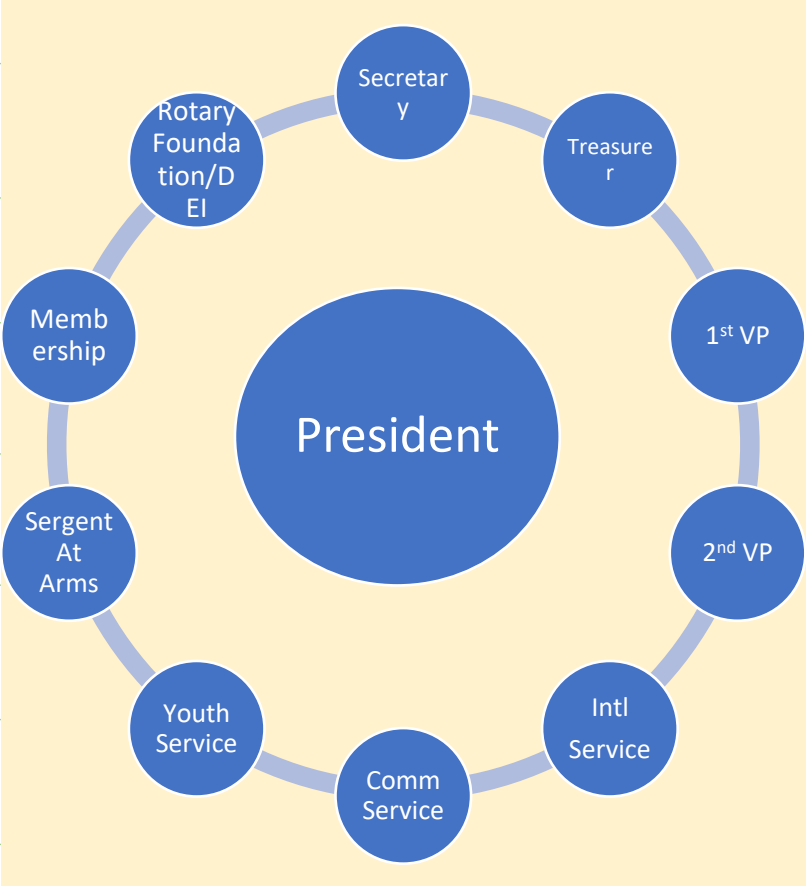

Ray of Hope Phase 4 Spectra Secondary School

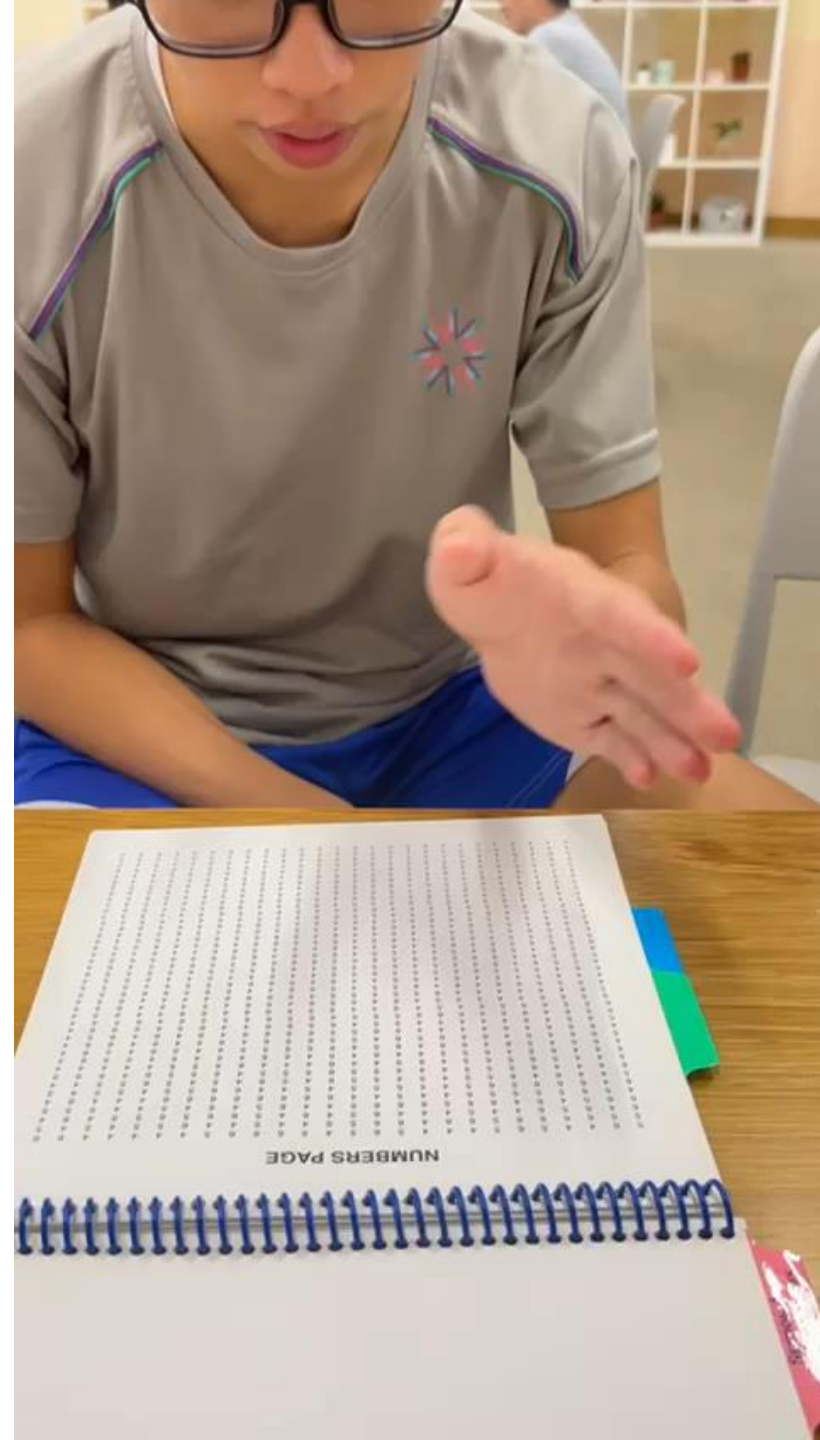
Project Goal:

To provide support and resources for students with Visual Processing Disorder (VPD) at Spectra Secondary School .

Key Activities:

- Conducted screenings for VPD in August 2024, identified 21 potential cases.
- Provided color overlays to all screened students. 8 students required prescription glasses with Irlen lenses.
- Eligible students on the Financial Assistance Scheme (FAS) received customized Irlen lenses at no cost.
- Ray of Hope is a joint initiative by E-Club 3310 and Irlen Dyslexic Clinic.
- 34 students have benefited from the project. The goal is to assist 20 beneficiaries per year.

About VPD: VPD is a condition affecting the brain's ability to process certain colors, leading to distorted or moving text. This can make reading, writing, and spelling difficult and stressful.



Project Ray of Hope Area of Focus Alignment:

1. Basic Education and Literacy:

Helping students with visual processing disorders addresses a specific educational challenge, supporting their learning needs and helping them achieve their academic goals.

1. Economic and Community Development:

Addressing educational challenges can indirectly contribute to community development by improving the long-term prospects and opportunities for these students, thereby benefiting the community.





Supporting Pontian Palliative Care



Palliative Care Center Area of Focus Alignment

- **Disease Prevention and Treatment:**

Providing essential health services will improve the quality of life for patients with serious illnesses.

- **Basic Education and Literacy:**

Offering resources and support to families dealing with health challenges Indirectly supports education and literacy.

- **Economic and Community Development:**

This alleviates financial and emotional burdens on families, contributing to the overall stability and well-being of the community.



Project Gracehaven

- **1. Project Gracehaven:** Supports young residents of Gracehaven through nutritious meals, sustainable living skills, and addressing their unique needs.
- **2. Monthly Meal Program: Rotary Moment** is happy mealtime.
- **3. Sustainable Activities:** Teaches valuable life skills through edible farming, cooking, baking, arts and crafts.
- **4. Support for Visual Processing Disorders:** Provides prescriptive colored lenses to help sufferers to read and learn better.
- **5. Mental Wellness Support:** Offers talks on mental wellness, coaching, mentoring, and befriending services to improve overall well-being.



Project Gracehaven

Area of Focus alignment



- This provides opportunities to learn new skills and improve on basic education and literacy. Equipping them with valuable skills will ensure they be able to contribute to economic development in their future.
- Edible farming ensures sustainable environmental protection.
- Visual Processing Disorder intervention, Rotary Moments, Mental Health & Self Enrichment Talks directly address the children's health and overall well-being.



Happy Meals for the Community

Project Goal:

Provides free, nutritious meals to frail, and physically challenged elderlies in Chinatown and Waterloo Street Mall.

Impact:

By offering weekly meals, we aim to improve the mental and emotional well-being of these individuals.

Results:

Since January 2021 to August 2024, a total of 12,200 Happy Meals have been distributed, positively impacting the lives of countless elderly residents in the community.





Project Happy Meal Area of Focus Alignment:

Economic and Community Development: This initiative helps improve the well-being of vulnerable populations, contributing to overall community stability and development.

Basic Education and Literacy: Volunteers especially the young ones benefit from personal fulfillment, skill development, community connection, enhanced empathy, improved mental health, and valuable networking opportunities.



Project Gift of Sight, Sarawak – Restoring Vision , Restoring Lives

Objective:

Provides life-changing cataract surgeries and intraocular lenses (IOLs) to impoverished individuals in Sarawak, Malaysia, restoring their sight and improving their quality of life.

Impact:

Through our collaborative efforts, we have successfully provided IOLs to 150 beneficiaries from low-income families in Sarawak in 2023. These surgeries have empowered individuals to regain their independence, participate more fully in society, and enjoy a brighter future.

Project Gift of Sight, Area of focus alignment

Project Gift of Sight aligns most closely with Rotary's area of focus on "Preventing disease."

The project specifically addresses the medical condition of cataracts, which can significantly impair vision. By providing cataract surgeries and intraocular lenses, the project directly contributes to preventing blindness and improving the overall health and well-being of the beneficiaries.



Objective:

Provides provisions and daily essentials to 1,500 low-income families in Singapore, helping to alleviate their financial burdens.

Collaboration:

Our collaboration with Hao Ren Hao Shi, a non-profit organization founded by Anson Ng, has enabled us to distribute food and essential supplies to families in need.

Volunteer Efforts:

E-club volunteers play a crucial role in raising funds, packing provisions, and distributing them to designated Housing Board estates.

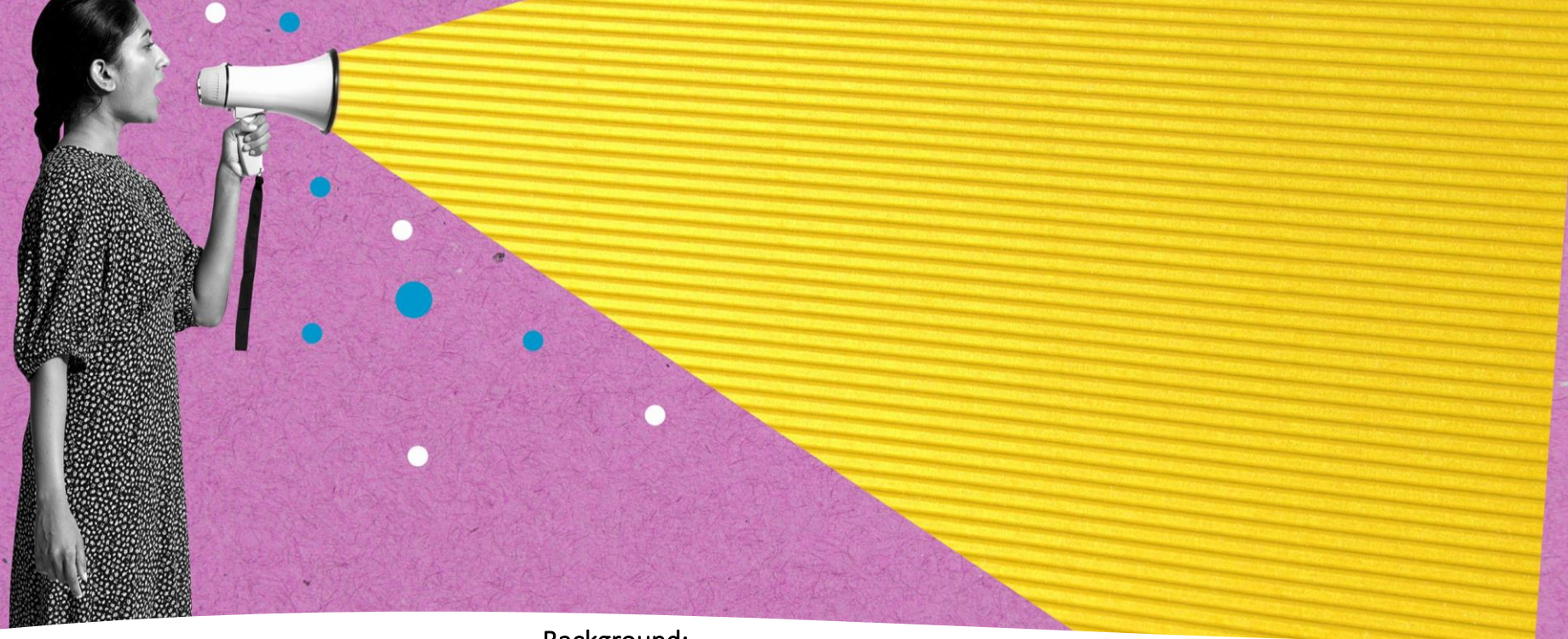


Provision Distribution
